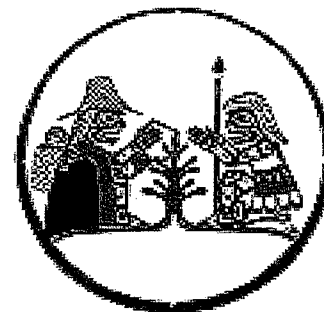

Outreach Program

Services are available to all women who 1) reside in the Campbell River and Gold River area; 2) who have experienced abuse, sexual assault, violence in relationship or childhood abuse, or are threatened by risk of abuse, sexual assault, or violence 3) and who are in need of support

Outreach Program is free and is able to assist Women by providing:

- local transportation
- information on relevant services
- referrals to appropriate services and supports
- appointment accompaniment
- advocacy
- a supportive listener
- to assist women, as needed, as they “navigate” their way through the various social/or legal systems
- follow-up

As this program has limited resources—the extent of services provided will be dependent on the individual situation, as well as on the scope and capacity of the program.

Stopping the Violence Outreach Program is committed to identifying “gaps” in services. We want to listen to your thoughts.

SUPPORT GROUPS

Part of this program is the establishment of support groups both in Campbell River and Gold River. As the support groups are consumer (Women) driven—times, locations, format etc. of the support groups will be announced at a later date.

EDUCATION SESSIONS

Education and awareness raising is an essential component in “Stopping the Violence” (STV) program. Therefore, the STV staff will be working with Women & other community members to develop appropriate and relevant education and awareness raising sessions.

HOW TO ACCESS THE PROGRAM

Women can access the Outreach Program through 1) self-referral, 2) peer/family referral and/or 3) by a referral from a program or organization.

While there may be a waitlist for One to One time with an Outreach Worker— all Women have access to the Support Groups and Education Sessions.
